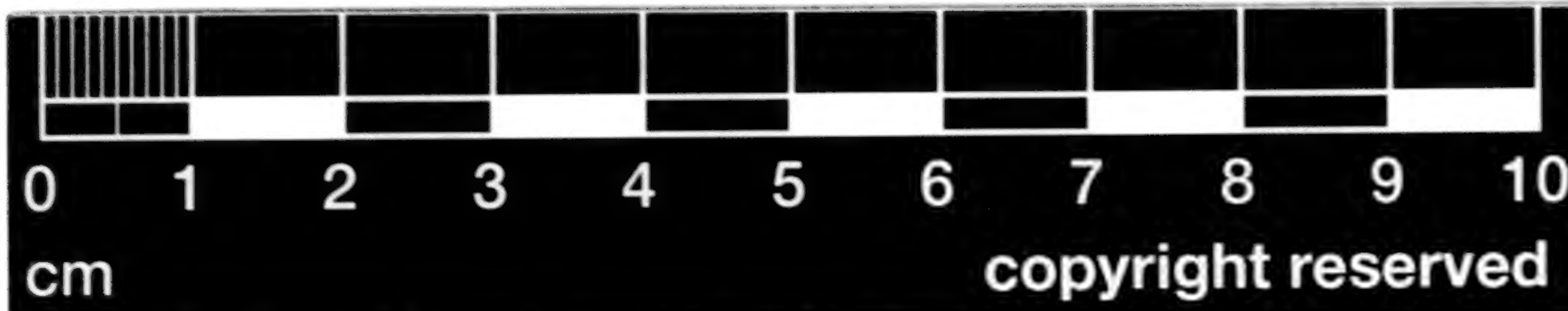

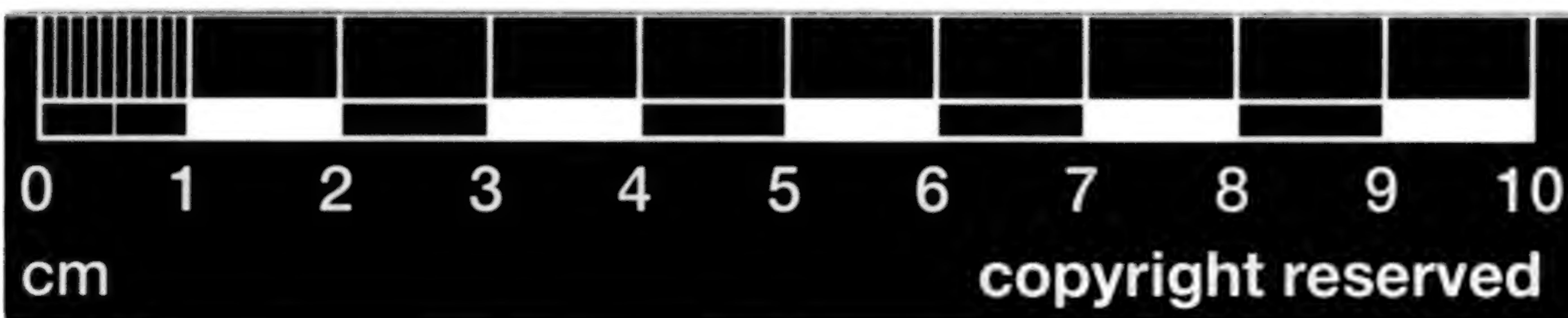

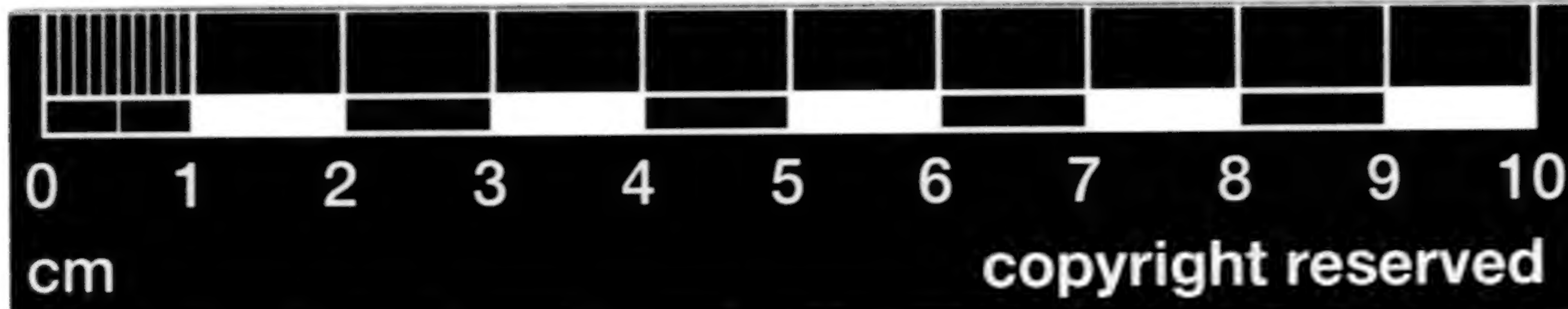
I send you this impression according to your direction, (in its first stage,) in two or three days will send you another.

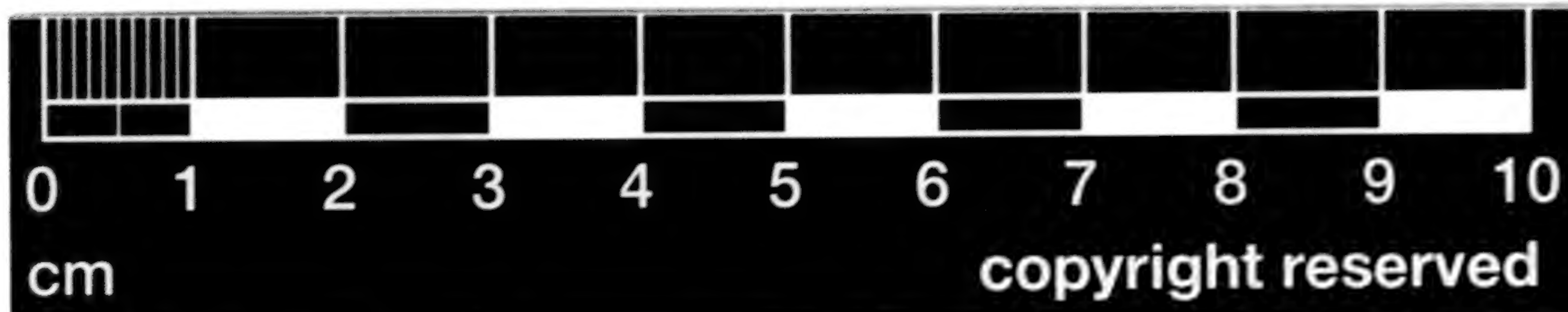


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Rev^d Munchen Oct 31st 1857

you wished,

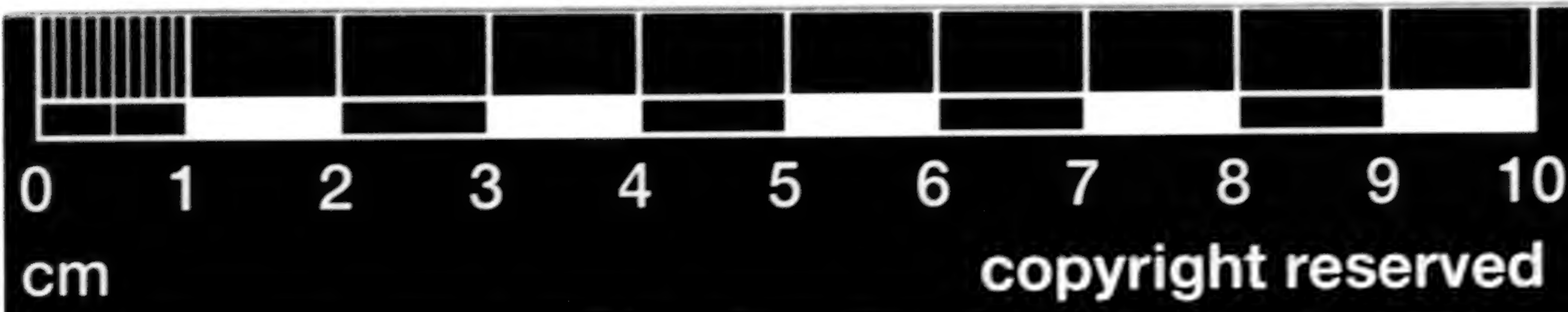
Your first letter was the cause of my

more than a fair price, I have tried hard



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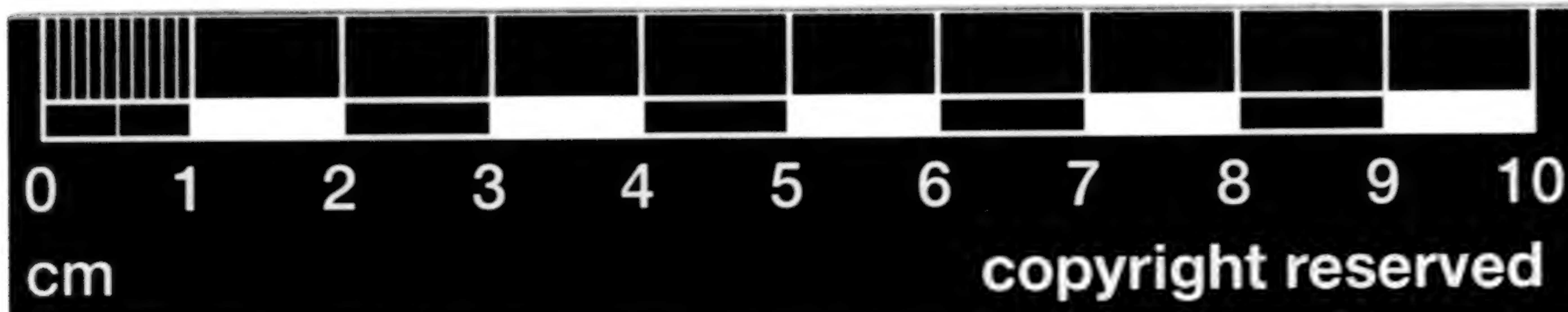


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To please you in these two plates and
